FIRST EVER JOINT ACTIVE SHOOTER TRAINING A SUCCESS

The Temple Terrace Police and Fire Departments conducted joint training exercise focusing on active shooter incident response / management and Mass Casualty Response on Tuesday and Thursday of last week. The training involved structured scenarios to allow our first responders to hone their skills in relation to crisis response, planning and procedures and will help assure a coordinated, timely and effective response and recovery in the event of an actual incident in the City. To assist with the safety of our Firefighter/Paramedics when responding to such an incident, each fire apparatus used by the City is now equipped with Ballistic Vests, Helmets and Medical Go Bags. The exercises garnered positive coverage for the City by WFLA, Fox13 News and other media outlets.

STAMM RECOGNIZED FOR HER WORK ON RELAY FOR LIFE

At Tuesday's Council meeting, the Mayor and City Council officially conveyed their gratitude to Customer Service Rep Kristina Stamm for her work as this year's coordinator of the City's Relay for Life fund-raising efforts. The City officially unveiled the new, improved Family Recreation Complex on Friday. The nearly year-long renovation included the construction of a new fitness center, improvements to outdoor basketball courts and the gymnastics center, revamped pool locker rooms, offices, classrooms and upgrades to the lobby of the building.

In addition to the structural upgrades, a snack bar/coffee shop was added to the Complex, staffed by Focus Academy students.

MAYOR JURADO NAMED HOME RULE HERO

The Florida League of Cities recently recognized Mayor Mel Jurado with a 2019 Home Rule Hero Award. The Mayor earned the award for her efforts to advance the League's legislative agenda and help protect the Home Rule powers of Florida's cities during the 2019 legislative session. Home Rule is the ability for a city to address local problems through and by local decision makers with minimal state interference.

ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY COMING TO THE TT LIBRARY

The Temple Terrace Public Library recently received a note from a patron who had come to our library with her children so they could use the computers to do research for their schoolwork. However, the patron, who is blind, was disappointed that our library did not have assistive technology, such as the JAWS (Job Access With Speech) screen reader program, so that she could also access a computer. Screen readers are software that enables those who cannot see the screen to access information on computers. The technology literally reads the screen aloud or converts it to Braille. In addition to reading text, screen readers can also translate pictures and charts to help the user access every component on the page. This technology can be very expensive, but the Hillsborough County IT staff have agreed to give us one of their software licenses so that we can make this very important technology available at the library. The software will be installed on a designated computer in the coming week.

On Monday, Remington Bronson, a patron who the Library assisted with repairs to his 3D printer by printing parts for him, demonstrated his printers and explained how anyone can get into 3D design.
