TTFD, TTPD PARTICIPATE IN REGIONAL ACTIVE SHOOTER EXERCISES

The TT Fire and Police Departments were proud to partner with more than a dozen other rescue and law enforcement agencies all across Hillsborough County for Active Shooter Training exercise at Pizzo Elementary at USF last Friday. This was the largest active shooter training in all of Central Florida, with the purpose of creating a Unified Command in response to the scene of a shooter or terrorist event. Hillsborough County Fire Rescue Special Ops Chief Robert Collins and Hillsborough County Sheriff Chad Chronister briefed the media on what they were seeing as we worked with paramedics and law enforcement to provide immediate medical care, triage patients and evacuate casualties. Besides our crews and HCFR and HCSO, the multi-agency Task Force included Tampa Fire Rescue, TPD, Plant City Fire Rescue, Plant City PD, USF PD, FHP, TIA PD, Seminole PD, Hillsborough Public Schools, Department of Homeland Security and the Transportation Security Administration.

SENIOR MOMENTS – OF THE BEST KIND

The Lightfoot Seniors gained valuable tips and important information on fall prevention this week. Dr. Mane from the MAR Primary Clinic presented a power point presentation that included "fall proofing" the home, drug side effects that may lead to falls, types of exercise that aide in balance and strength, and many more fall prevention tips and tricks. It is critical for seniors to work hard at preventing the first fall as they are 50% more likely to have subsequent falls following that first incident.

Hear Ye! Hear Ye! The USF Audiology and Speech Laboratory made a presentation to the Lightfoot Seniors this week. The seminar included information on new technologies available for those with hearing impairments, research being done at USF in these fields, and causes as signs of hearing loss.

OUR LIBRARY ROCKS!



Last Thursday, adults got in touch with their creative side and painted galaxy rocks in keeping with the *Universe of Stories* summer reading theme. Teens also honored the theme by playing the Story Cube Edition of our Game Zone at the library. The Library purchased four sets of Rory's Story Cubes (Original, Action, Voyages, and Fantasia) for the teens & tweens to play. Story Cubes are like dice, with images on each side... players roll them and then invent a story that works in all the actions or items shown. Some amazing stories were concocted! Our creative teens decided to play with multiple sets simultaneously, for more elaborate adventures, and added an artistic element by asking for colored pencils and drawing paper, so they could illustrate each other's stories.

BUT WAIT, THERE'S MORE...

In other Library programming, Storyteller Tamara Green shared her talent of storytelling with the families at the library as she made folktales come alive with instruments and her dynamic sound effects and teen competed in an Aerospace Paper Design Competition, in which everyone designed and flew their best airplanes or spacecraft. Reference books, paper plane examples contributed by the library staff, and lots of chances for iterative development and peer coaching helped teens improve their aerodynamics of their planes as the tournament progressed. Winners were chosen by fellow-teen judges in three events: Distance, Accuracy (flying through a hoop), and Fancy Flying (loops, corkscrews, and a tornado were favorites).
