AUDIT COMMITTEE LOOKING FOR QUALIFIED APPLICANT

The City currently is seeking qualified applicants for appointment to the Audit Committee. The Temple Terrace Audit Committee was created in 2010 in accordance with Florida State Statute 218.391. The Committee is comprised of a City Council Member, a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) and the Finance Director, who provides staff support. According to policy, the appointee is selected by the City Manager for a term that coincides with the expiration of the approved audit contract. Meetings will be quarterly or on an as needed basis and will be held at City Hall.
