You may not think of it but there are those out there who will want to scam you if you're looking for employment. So this week's tip has to do with protecting yourself while looking for employment. Look out for signs of a job scam, they include if you need to pay to get the job, you need to supply your credit card information or bank account information, and the of there is an ad for a "previously undisclosed" federal government job, all open federal jobs are public information and are announced on <http://www.usajobs.gov/>. When working with job placement services make sure you check with the company that you are looking at is hiring through that hiring service. Make sure when contacting a hiring service that you get details in writing as to cost, benefit, and who carries that burden for cost. Understand the difference between a job placement company and job counseling. Counseling involves find a career path where placement involves actually getting a job. Check for complaints about a hiring company, search the name of the company with the keywords like review, scam, or complaint to better protect yourself from misinformation. Most importantly if you feel that you have been targeted in a scam you may file a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission, for more details and information on job scams visit <http://www.consumer.ftc.gov/>.
