## BLACK HISTORY MONTH

At last week's City Council meeting, Mayor Ross and the Council recognized February as Black History Month. Long time Temple Terrace resident Pastor Moses Brown, founder of Feed Our Children.org, was invited by Council Member Abel to accept the proclamation, which included a recognition that "Black History is integral to American history" and noted that the commemoration would "serve as a reminder of the need for meaningful dialogue and share commitment to actions that uplift and empower all."



## HELP FOR THOSE IN CRISIS

Also at the last City Council meeting, Clara Reynolds, president and CEO of the Crisis Center of Tampa, gave a presentation about the many services offered by the Center. The Crisis Center of Tampa Bay serves the community as resource for people who are struggling with a variety of crisis situations including sexual assault or abuse, domestic violence, financial distress, substance abuse, medical emergency, suicidal thoughts and other emotional or situational problems. Reynolds reported that many people in Temple Terrace have availed themselves of this cost-free assistance in recent months, but they are hoping to connect with others in need. Available 24/7, 365 days a year, the Center can be reached by calling 2-1-1.
